
1898. Imperforate essays.













# Cambodia Clerk of Court Fees Use of 20 cents

A pair of 2-cent stamps for the clerk of court fees were affixed to a handwritten document.



In 1945 after Allied military units entered Cambodia, the Japanese military forces present in the country were disarmed and repatriated. The French were able to reimpose the colonial administration in Phnom Penh in October the same year. Sihanouk's "royal crusade for independence" resulted in grudging French acquiescence to his demands for a transfer of sovereignty. A partial agreement was struck in October 1953.


1953. Format 35 x 19 mm. Perforated 13½. Modeled after preceding Indochinese revenues with empty circle at left and inscribed in the background "TIMBRE FISCAL." Printed in bister (cent values) or yellow-green (piaster vales). Overprinted "CAMBODGE" in French and Cambodian with value in blue (cent values) or red (piaster vales).













1953. Format 35 x 19 mm. Perforated  $13\frac{1}{2}$ . Similar design but rooster image placed incircle. Black overprint "TIMBRE FISCAL" in French and Cambodian. Printed in bister with blue overprint (cent values), green with red overprint (1-10 piaster vales) or pink with blue overprint (20-100 piasters).
