During the period 1886-88, officials approved the overprinting of available stocks of Commerce stamps to cope with the shortage of 5 and 15-centime stamps in Cochinchina. Four different overprint types were applied to four different Commerce denominations resulting in five basic overprint varieties.



A single 5 on 25 centimes yellow paid the postage for an unsealed printed matter mailing from Saigon to France in 1886. The first day of use for this stamp was 16 May 1886, the date of the mailing.

A single copy of the 5 C. CH. on 25 centimes yellow paid for mailing a small, unsealed envelope likely containing a calling card with New Year's greetings. Posted in January 1887 at Saigon, the envelope was addressed to Choquan.

A mixture of low-value Commerce and Navigation and Commerce stamps contributed to the 15 centimes postage for this internal mailing from Cantho to Longxuyen in 1894. The stamp with the greatest denomination was the "5 C. CH." on 25-centimes yellow provisional overprint.



Commerce Cochinchina Provisional Overprints Use of 5 on 25 centimes black

A single example of the overprinted 5 on 25 centimes black Commerce stamp paid the 5-centime drop letter rate for a printed death notice in 1887. The notice was addressed to a doctor aboard a Messageries Maritimes ship at Saigon.

The notice is a folded two-page form. The edges of each page bear the black border signifying mourning. The printed notice informs recipients that Madame Thérèse-Julie-Aglaé Pujol had died at the age of 58 at her home in Paris. On the inside, the notice is dated 9 March 1887.

A strip of five overprinted stamps correctly paid the postage for a mailing from Saigon to France in February 1887. It is ironic that 25-centime stamps were overprinted due to a shortage of 5-centime stamps, yet five of them were required to make up the 25-centime letter rate to France.

In combination with three 10-centime Commerce stamps, three overprinted stamps (each with a postal value of 15 centimes) paid the postage for a registered mailing to France in 1888. Postage was calculated as:

registration fee	25 centimes
total	75 centimes

Five copies of the 15/15 overprint were symmetrically arranged on the flap-side of a registered mailing from Vinhlong, Cochinchina to France in 1896. Posted at Vinhlong by the post orderly via the military postal system (with commander's endorsement on flap), the letter must have been a second weight step letter to require 75 centimes worth of postage.

Three different Cochinchina overprints frank a cover posted into Paris in 1887. Likely, another copy of a 5 centime stamp had fallen off of the mailing as the letter rate was 25 centimes at the time. The letter was addressed to Arthur Maury, a famous Parisian stamp dealer of the 1800s.
